End-of-Session Letter 2020 Maryland General Assembly Regular Session April 30, 2020

Introduction

Despite the early adjournment, much progress was made during the 2020 General Assembly Regular Session. This newsletter is a brief summary of legislation affecting District 9B, as well as a recap of selected statewide bills. Of great significance are three bills passed that relate directly to providing funding to make historic Ellicott City safe from flooding. HB 78 will make Ellicott City eligible for the existing Chesapeake Bay Restoration Fund, HB 539 enables the county to create a Resilience Authority as an alternate funding source, and finally HB 428 provides \$8,000,000 in this budget toward the county's Safe and Sound plan. Given the shortened session, it was remarkable that we were able to shepherd these bills through to passage. A Note About the COVID-19 Impact

State spending will surely be curtailed due to the impact of COVID-19 on our economy. What that looks like, and how much of an impact the virus will have on our state budget is something that will evolve over the next twelve months.

Session Wrap Up Postponed

We scheduled an end-of-session wrap up for the end of April at the Miller Branch Library as we did last year. However, it seemed prudent to postpone it considering the current Gubernatorial executive orders. We hope to have a community meeting as soon as we are safely able to do so.

Wednesday, April 3rd was the deadline to apply for a District 9B higher education scholarship. Our office received over 60 applications from residents of District 9B for the House of Delegates Legislative Scholarship. We hope to stay on schedule and award the scholarships in May, though the process is dependent on the Maryland Higher Education Commission to administer the scholarships. All applicants will be apprised of any changes.

District 9B Legislative Recap - Results for Ellicott City

<u>HB 78</u> <u>Bay Restoration Fund - Authorized Uses</u> (**Primary Sponsor**)

This bill expands the criteria used to determine how to allocate funding from the Bay Restoration Fund (BRF) Wastewater Account by including climate resiliency and flood control as issues for the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) to consider when determining the priority of funding for specified projects. *Passed both chambers*

<u>HB 539</u> <u>Local Governments - Resilience Authorities - Authorization</u> (**Primary Sponsor**)

This bill would enable counties and municipalities to create "Resilience authorities" for the purpose of issuing bonds to help critical resilience-related infrastructure projects.

Bond Bill Ho.Co. 27-20, Sidewalks and Streetscapes (Primary Sponsor)

This project is intended to replace and reconstruct sidewalks and related streetscape along Main Street in Ellicott City. As a result of flash-flooding in 2016 and 2018, large portions of the sidewalks were damaged.

COVID-19 Emergency Bills

In response to the COVID-19 public health threat, Governor Hogan declared a state of emergency to mobilize all resources necessary to respond to the threat. As part of the response, the Speaker of the House introduced legislation that allows the Governor to take specific actions to address the public health emergency.

<u>HB 1661</u>	Allows the Governor to transfer up to \$50 million from the state's Rainy Day Fund to mobilize necessary resources. Passed both chambers
<u>HB 1663</u>	Allows the Governor to take action to expand healthcare coverage, unemployment benefits and consumer protections for Maryland residents. <i>Passed both chambers</i>

On the last day of the session, the House and Senate amended the budget to allow the Governor to access up to \$100 million extra in funding to support small business and re-open hospitals during the COVID-19 crisis.
